To make it convenient for their residents, these cities have contracted with Bona Vista to bill for services that they offer their residents such as garbage, recycling, storm water, etc. This allows residents to pay a single bill each month instead of two or more.

# 2022 Drought Restrictions

Please note the District is constantly reviewing forecasted runoff projections, soil moistures, SNOTEL data and other pertinent information to ensure that water restrictions implemented are reflective of actual conditions. The noted restrictions below are subject to change:

- 💧 Do not use culinary water to supplement irrigating or sprinkling of lawn or landscapes. Doing so will result in a fine of \$100 per day/incident.
  - If you are considering installing landscape, reach out to your secondary water provider to ensure that you are following their restrictions.
  - **Culinary water is not to be used to keep new landscape alive when secondary water is unavailable.**
  - The District is not responsible for any loss of landscaping due to the lack of water to maintain and/or establish the landscape.
  - Consider prepping and planting in the late fall to allow next winters moisture to help establish young plants or grass.
- 💧 Limit car washing. Use a bucket and a positive pressure nozzle on the end of the hose so that water is not running continuously. Wash the vehicle on the lawn or any permeable surface to 'reuse' the water or consider visiting a car wash where the water is used more efficiently and, in some cases, even recycled.
- 💧 Do not hose down hard surfaces such as sidewalks or driveways except for health or safety.
- 💧 Outdoor fountains and ponds should not have water spraying above the fountain or pond surface.
- 💧 Swimming pools should be covered when not in use to reduce evaporation. Also, levels should be kept lower to reduce water loss from splashing. If Utah enters the Extreme Drought Phase, pools of any kind shall not be filled.

There are a very limited number of residential Bona Vista customers who are allowed to use culinary water for outside purposes. These customers hooked up to the District's system prior to secondary water being available in their area. For these customers, we are asking that they adhere to Weber Basin Water's drought standards as they are the Districts largest water supplier. In addition to the restrictions listed above, restrictions for these customers will also include:

- 💧 Shortened water season - mid-May to mid-September.
- 💧 One day a week watering of lawns and gardens:
  - 20 minutes for pop-up sprays and 40-minutes for rotors.
  - Consider watering for half the time, but twice within the same day. This allows the water distributed with the first run to soak in so the second watering penetrates deeper. For example, set your stations to run for 10 minutes each at 10pm and then again for 10 minutes at midnight.
- 💧 No watering between 10am and 6pm.
- 💧 One day a week hand watering of established trees and shrubs.
- 💧 No hosing down of hard surfaces such as sidewalks or driveways.
- 💧 Find and eliminate waste of any kind. Detect and fix leaks as soon as possible. Direct sprinkler heads so that they are not watering the street, sidewalk, or other hard surfaces.
